

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of June 30, 1994, and with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 284.

AN ACT concerning

**Prince George's County – Alcoholic Beverages Licenses**

FOR the purpose of extending until a certain date a prohibition against the issuing or transferring of certain alcoholic beverages licenses within certain legislative districts of Prince George's County.
