In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 298.

This bill would establish a World War II Memorial Commission and direct the Commission to develop recommendations for the creation of a memorial to honor those citizens of Maryland who served in action in the armed forces of the United States during that conflict.

House Bill 536, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 14, 1991, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 298.

Senate Bill No. 298

AN ACT concerning

World War II Memorial

FOR the purpose of establishing a World War II Memorial Commission; directing the Commission to develop recommendations for the creation of a memorial to honor those citizens of Maryland who served in action in the armed forces of the United States during that conflict; providing for the appointment of members; construing this Act to require certain support to be provided by certain staff; and generally relating to the World War II Memorial Commission.

Preamble

WHEREAS, Many citizens of Maryland served in the armed forces of the United States during World War II; and

WHEREAS, The creation of a memorial to recognize the valor of those persons will ensure that their dedication, valor, and sacrifice will be remembered and honored; and

WHEREAS, The people of Maryland want the brave deeds of those men and women to be recognized; and
