SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Tax - Property

9-318.

- (b) (1) The governing body of Prince George's County may grant, by law, a property tax credit under this section against county property tax imposed on:
  - (v) real property that is:
- 1. owned by the American [Institute of] CENTER FOR Physics <u>INC.</u>;
- 2. leased by the American [Institute of] CENTER FOR Physics <u>INC.</u> to affiliated societies; and
- 3. used only for nonprofit activities relating to the advancement and diffusion of the knowledge of physics and its application to human welfare.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 313.

This bill would expand the law of negotiable instruments by permitting the holder of a dishonored check or other instrument which has been negotiated to the holder to send a notice of dishonor to the maker or drawer and to recover fees and other damages from the maker or drawer.

House Bill 152, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 14, 1991, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 313.
