1991, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 394.

AN ACT concerning

## Radiation - Regulation of Radiation Sources - Fee Schedule for Dental Offices and Facilities

FOR the purpose of authorizing the Secretary of the Environment to adopt regulations establishing a schedule of fees to be assessed against a dental office, dental facility, or dental practice in connection with the monitoring and regulation of radiation machines or other sources of radiation; establishing limitations on the amount of those fees; providing for an offset for fees collected before a certain date providing for the suspension of the payment of certain fees if inspections are not performed in a certain period; establishing a limitation on the frequency of inspections; authorizing reinspections and fees related to reinspections exempting certain dental schools from certain regulations; and generally relating to the regulation of radiation sources in dental offices or facilities.
