- (ii) Subject to any registration requirements the Secretary requires, recognize licenses issued by the federal government or any other state; and
- (iii) [Based] EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN §-8-301(C) SUBSECTIONS (C) AND (D) OF THIS SECTION, BASED on the anticipated cost of monitoring and regulating sources of radiation, establish a fee schedule for general licenses, specific licenses, and the registration of radiation machines or other sources of radiation issued under this section.
- (2) If the Secretary finds that allowing the exemptions will not constitute a significant risk to the health and safety of the public, the Secretary may adopt rules and regulations that exempt from the licensing or registration requirements of this section:
 - (i) Specific sources of ionizing radiation;
 - (ii) Specific kinds of uses of ionizing radiation; and
 - (iii) Specific kinds of users of ionizing radiation.
- (3) In adopting the regulations under paragraph (1)(iii) of this subsection, the Department shall consult with the regulated profession or industry to determine that the license fee is reasonable and directly related to the actual cost of the licensing and regulatory activity.
- (C) (1) FOR A DENTAL OFFICE OR DENTAL FACILITY OPERATED BY A LICENSED DENTIST, A PARTNERSHIP OF LICENSED DENTISTS, A PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATION OF LICENSED DENTISTS, A DENTAL SCHOOL, OR A PUBLIC HEALTH DENTAL FACILITY, THE SECRETARY MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS THAT ESTABLISH A FEE TO OFFSET THE COSTS OF MONITORING AND REGULATING SOURCES OF RADIATION WITHIN THAT DENTAL FACILITY. FEES ASSESSED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE ASSESSED AT THE TIME AN INSPECTION IS PERFORMED, AND PAYMENT SHALL BE MADE WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE INSPECTION.
- (2) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE FEES ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION MAY NOT EXCEED:
- (I) \$150 FOR THE INSPECTION OF 3 OR FEWER DENTAL RADIATION MACHINES MAINTAINED AND OPERATED WITHIN A SINGLE DENTAL OFFICE OR FACILITY; AND
- (II) AN ADDITIONAL \$100 FEE FOR THE INSPECTION OF ALL DENTAL RADIATION MACHINES IN EXCESS OF 3 WHICH ARE MAINTAINED AND OPERATED WITHIN A SINGLE DENTAL OFFICE OR FACILITY.
- (3) EXCEPT WHEN PROBABLE CAUSE EXISTS THAT THE CONDITION OF A DENTAL RADIATION MACHINE OR MACHINES MAY BE A DANGER TO PUBLIC HEALTH OR SAFETY, INSPECTIONS OF DENTAL RADIATION MACHINES MAY BE PERFORMED AT EACH DENTAL OFFICE OR FACILITY NOT MORE THAN ONCE EVERY 3 YEARS.
