- (3) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE STAFF FOR THE COUNCIL.
- (F) THE MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION OR REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES.
 5–593.

THE COUNCIL SHALL:

- (1) ADVISE AND COUNSEL THE CHILD CARE ADMINISTRATION OF THE DEPARTMENT;
- (2) REVIEW <u>CHILD CARE</u> REGULATIONS PROPOSED BY <u>THE</u> <u>CHILD CARE ADMINISTRATION AND OTHER</u> STATE AGENCIES REGULATING CHILD CARE FOR THE PURPOSE OF INSURING COORDINATION AND CONSISTENCY;
- (3) REVIEW ISSUES AND PROBLEMS RELATING TO CARE OF CHILDREN AND SUGGEST PRIORITIES FOR CONSIDERATION BY THE CHILD CARE ADMINISTRATION OF THE DEPARTMENT; AND
- (4) IDENIFTY IDENTIFY INTERDEPARTMENTAL ISSUES OF IMPORTANCE TO CHILD CARE PROVIDERS AND USERS THAT SHOULD BE ADDRESSED BY THE CHILD CARE ADMINISTRATION OF THE DEPARTMENT AND OTHER STATE AGENCIES.

SECTION 2. AND BE-IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of the initial members of the Child Care Administration Advisory Council shall expire as follows:

- (1) 8 members in 1994;
- (2) 8 members in 1993; and
- (3) 8 members in 1992.

SECTION 3. 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.
