In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 144.

This bill would allow the Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) to suspend the commercial driver's license of a seizure prone individual for one year from the last seizure. (Currently MVA can suspend for only 90 days.)

Senate Bill 223, which was passed by the General Assembly and will be signed by me on April 30, 1991, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 144.

AN ACT concerning

Driver's Licenses - Epilepsy - Restoration Following Ineligibility

FOR the purpose of authorizing the Motor Vehicle Administration to issue a certain driver's license, under certain circumstances, to an individual following the individual's period of ineligibility for a license because of the individual's epilepsy; authorizing the Administration to require an individual to be tested or to impose certain restrictions on the license of an individual following a period of ineligibility for a license because of the individual's epilepsy; requiring the Administration to adopt regulations to administer the provisions of this Act; altering the description of evidence upon which the Administration may base a suspension, revocation, or refusal to issue or renew the driver's license of an individual with epilepsy; and generally relating to qualifications for driver's licenses for individuals with epilepsy.
