In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 428.

This bill would provide for the continuance of the School Health Pilot Program by extending the date of termination. It also altered other aspects of the Program.

Senate Bill 389, which was passed by the General Assembly and was signed by me on April 30, 1991, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 428.

House Bill No. 428

AN ACT concerning

School Health Pilot Program

FOR the purpose of continuing the School Health Pilot Program (Program) in accordance with the Maryland Program Evaluation Act by extending to a certain date the termination provision relating to the Program; altering the design, purposes, and objectives of the Program; specifying that funds for the Program shall be used to acquire certain health care providers; altering the duties of a certain research analyst; repealing certain education requirements; altering the duties of the health care providers assigned to the schools participating in the Program; repealing certain obsolete provisions relating to the goals of the Program; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to the School Health Pilot Program.
