- [(3)] (III) The provisions of this [subsection] PARAGRAPH do not apply to claims [with respect to which there], OR A PORTION OF A CLAIM, IF:
- 1. THERE is a good faith dispute regarding the legitimacy of the claim or the appropriate amount of reimbursement; OR AND
- 2. ANY UNDISPUTED PORTION OF THE CLAIM IS REIMBURSED WITHIN 30 DAYS OF FILING THE CLAIM.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 816.

This bill would expand the arrest powers of the State Fire Marshal and a full-time assistant for cases of threats of arson and acts relating to pipe bombs.

Senate Bill 524, which was passed by the General Assembly and was signed by me on April 30, 1991, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 816.
