Dear Mr. Speaker:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 944.

This bill would exempt from gross weight requirements vehicles transporting farm products and supplies to or from a farm on other than an interstate highway.

Senate Bill 644, which was passed by the General Assembly and was signed by me on May 24, 1991, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 944.

AN ACT concerning

Vehicle Laws - ~~Gross Weight~~ - Exemptions

FOR the purpose of exempting for a certain time from certain gross weight requirements ~~a motor vehicle~~ certain vehicles transporting certain farm products and supplies to or from a farm on other than an interstate highway under certain circumstances; altering certain provisions relating to weight limit tolerances; authorizing the Department of Transportation to issue certain special registrations or permits, and to require a special registration or permit to qualify for a certain exemption; and generally relating to exemptions from certain ~~motor~~ vehicle ~~gross~~ weight requirements.
