

(1) COMPENSATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STATE BUDGET; AND

(2) REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from the tenth sentence and, as it related to voting, the ninth sentence of former Art. 89, § 31(a) and the second sentence of (g).

In subsection (b) of this section, the word "meetings" is substituted for the former narrower words "public hearing", since there seemed to be no intent to enable the Board to meet only for a public hearing required under § 5-310(d) of this subtitle.

In the introductory language of subsection (c) of this section, the reference to "[e]ach appointed member" is substituted for the former reference to "[t]he members of the Board, other than the Commissioner", for brevity and conformity to § 5-303 of this subtitle.

In subsection (c)(2) of this section, the phrases "as provided in the State budget" are added to avoid the erroneous suggestion that only compensation is subject to budgetary limits.

As to subsection (c)(1) of this section, under SF § 10-203, the Board of Public Works has adopted regulations for reimbursement of expenses. See COMAR 23.02.01.01 through .12.

The Labor and Employment Article Review Committee notes, for consideration by the General Assembly, the lack of an express provision establishing the number of members who constitute a quorum. In the absence of an express provision, case law indicates that a majority of the members is a quorum. See Gemeny v. Prince George's County, 264 Md. 85, 285 A.2d 602 (1972); Zeiler v. Central Ry., 84 Md. 304, 35 A. 932 (1896); and Heiskell v. Mayor of Baltimore, 65 Md. 125, 4 A. 116 (1886).
