(1957 EDITION AS AMENDED), TITLE "CORPORATION-MUNICIPAL", SUBTITLE "HOME RULE", TO AMEND THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF GREENBELT FOUND, IN WHOLE OR IN PART, IN THE COMPILATION OF MUNICIPAL CHARTERS OF MARYLAND (1983 EDITION AS AMENDED), AS PREPARED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 77 OF THE ACTS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND OF 1983, BY REPEALING AND REENACTING WITH AMENDMENTS "ELECTIONS" SECTIONS 14, 15, 18, 19, 26, AND 33, INCLUSIVE, TO DELETE FROM THE CITY CHARTER PROVISIONS INCONSISTENT WITH UNIVERSAL REGISTRATION PROVISIONS AS SET FORTH IN ARTICLE 33 OF THE ANNOTATED CODE OF MARYLAND OF 1957, AS AMENDED, AND TO PROVIDE FOR CONCURRENT REGISTRATION WITH THE PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTION SUPERVISORS UNDER THE STATE OF MARYLAND GENERAL ELECTION LAWS

AN RESOLUTION concerning

Redevelopment Projects

FOR the purpose of expressly reaffirming and incorporating by reference the powers and authority granted to the City of Hagerstown by Chapter 830 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1961, which generally authorizes and empowers the City to adopt, administer, and enforce projects, plans, and related activities for the redevelopment, rehabilitation, conservation, clearance, or renewal of slum and blighted areas; declares these projects, plans, and activities to constitute governmental functions in furtherance of which the City is authorized, among other powers, to establish and enforce regulations for the voluntary or compulsory repair and rehabilitation of buildings and improvements, acquire, use, and dispose of property, exercise the power of eminent domain, impose taxes, expend public funds, and extend public credit; and grants to the City certain additional powers necessary or proper to carry into full force and effect these projects, plans, and activities, subject to certain restrictions and limitations on certain powers.
