

COUNTY LOCAL LAWS

**Bill 1990-3**

AN ACT to amend Chapter 18 of the Wicomico County Code, titled "Compensation and Allowance Commission", Section 3 thereof, titled "Compensation for County Council members", to provide for the compensation of members of the Wicomico County Council.

WHEREAS, the County Council of Wicomico County has heretofore received the report of the County Council Compensation and Allowance Commission for Wicomico County, dated December 5, 1989, as provided for in Chapter 18 of the Wicomico County Code, and, as a result of said report, deems it advisable to adjust the compensation to be paid to the members of the Wicomico County Council, commencing with the County Council elected in 1990.

Passed February 13, 1990.

**Bill 1990-4**

AN ACT to amend Chapter 183 of the Wicomico County Code, titled "Plumbing", by repealing and reenacting with amendments Sections 183-4, 183-5, 183-22(A), 183-23, 183-30, and Article IV, entitled "Amendments to Code."

WHEREAS, it appears, upon the favorable recommendation of the Plumbing Official, advisable to amend the aforesaid Sections and Article of the Wicomico County Code, to adopt, with amendments, the State of Maryland Plumbing Code, in order to standardize the enforcement of Plumbing Code requirements within Wicomico County.

**Bill 1990-7**

AN ACT to amend Chapter 225 of the Wicomico County Code, titled "Zoning", Article VII, entitled "Commercial District", Subsection 30 B, titled "Uses Permitted by Special Exception".

WHEREAS, it appears, advisable to amend the aforesaid Section of the Wicomico County Code, upon the favorable recommendation of the Wicomico County Planning and Zoning Commission by allowing cemeteries and light industrial uses of limited size in commercial districts;

**Bill 1990-8**

AN ACT to amend Chapter 225 of the Wicomico County Code, titled "Zoning" by amending Section 225-104 A, and by repealing and re-enacting with amendments, Section 225-110, entitled "Violations and Penalties."
