8-504. REGULATIONS.

THE BOARD OF APPEALS SHALL ADOPT REASONABLE REGULATIONS TO GOVERN APPEALS AND HEARINGS UNDER THIS TITLE.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 95A, § 11(a) (3) and the second sentence of § 7(g).

The reference to governing "appeals and hearings" is substituted for the former reference to governing "the manner of filing appeals and the conduct of hearings and appeals", for brevity.

The former language "consistent with the provisions of this article" is deleted as unnecessary in light of provisions in the State Government Article that require a regulation to contain a citation of the statutory authority for the regulation and require a regulation to be approved by the Attorney General for legality. 8–505. AUTHORITY OF BOARD OF APPEALS AS TO OATHS, SUBPOENAS, AND TESTIMONY.

(A) OATHS, DEPOSITIONS, AND CERTIFICATION OF OFFICIAL ACTS.

TO ENFORCE THIS TITLE, A MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF APPEALS, OR A DESIGNEE OF A MEMBER MAY:

- (1) ADMINISTER AN OATH;
- (2) CERTIFY TO AN OFFICIAL ACT; AND
- (3) TAKE A DEPOSITION.
- (B) SUBPOENAS.
- (1) TO ENFORCE THIS TITLE, THE BOARD OF APPEALS OR A DESIGNEE OF THE BOARD OF APPEALS MAY ISSUE A SUBPOENA FOR THE ATTENDANCE OF A WITNESS TO TESTIFY OR THE PRODUCTION OF BOOKS, CORRESPONDENCE, MEMORANDA, PAPERS, AND OTHER RECORDS.
- (2) A SUBPOENA ISSUED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE SERVED IN ANY MANNER IN WHICH COURT SUBPOENAS ARE AUTHORIZED TO BE SERVED.
