

(2) "REGULAR BENEFITS" DOES NOT INCLUDE:

(I) BENEFITS PAYABLE TO A FEDERAL CIVILIAN EMPLOYEE OR A FORMER SERVICEMEMBER UNDER 5 U.S.C. CHAPTER 85; OR

(II) EXTENDED BENEFITS.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This subsection is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 95A, § 21(a)(4) and (8).

Paragraph (2)(i) of this subsection is revised to exclude benefits for federal civilian employees and former servicemembers. Under former Art. 95A, § 21(a)(4), those benefits seemed to be "included". However, the reference to those benefits was contained in a parenthetical that referred back to the words "but not".

In paragraph (2)(i) of this subsection, the reference to a "former servicemember" is substituted for the former reference to "ex-servicemen", for gender neutrality in accordance with SG § 2-1318(b)(7).

The former reference to "additional benefits pursuant to § 23 or under any other State law" is deleted as obsolete, since additional benefits were discontinued as of June 9, 1984.

UNLESS THE RESULT WOULD BE INCONSISTENT WITH ANOTHER PROVISION OF THIS PART III OF THIS SUBTITLE OR WITH THE FEDERAL-STATE EXTENDED UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION ACT OF 1970, THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE THAT APPLY TO CLAIMS FOR OR THE PAYMENT OF REGULAR BENEFITS SHALL APPLY TO EXTENDED BENEFITS.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 95A, § 21(b).

The phrase "as amended", which formerly modified "the Federal-State Extended Unemployment Compensation Act of 1970", is deleted as unnecessary in light of Art. 1, § 21 which provides that "[w]henver a provision of the public general ... laws of this State refers ... to any other law, the reference applies to any subsequent amendment to that ... other law, unless the referring provision expressly provides otherwise".
