development appropriation (\$17.1 million) and Heritage Conservation Fund (\$1 million).

The legislature recognizes the difficult economic times and the necessity of balancing a budget shortfall. This reduction is made with the intent of providing funds for Program Open Space activities through debt financing rather than PAYGO funds in FY 1992. It is also the intent of the legislature to discontinue support for using up to 25% of Program Open Space funds for development only in FY 1992. Further, beginning in FY 1993, it is the intent of the legislature to continue support for using up to 25% of Program Open Space funds for development.

Provided that of the Special Fund Appropriation, \$19,659,500 \$1,659,500 \$5,500,000 \$3,462,000 represents that share of Program Open Space revenues available State projects and \$17,103,500 \$8,650,000 represents that share of Program Open Space revenues available for local programs. These amounts may be used for any State projects or local shares authorized in Chapter 403, Laws of Maryland, 1969, as amended, or in Chapter 81, Laws of Maryland, 1984; or in Chapter 106, Laws of Maryland, 1985; or in Chapter 109, Laws of Maryland, 1986; or in Chapter 121, Laws of Maryland, 1987; or in Chapter 10, Laws of Maryland, 1988; Chapter 14, Laws of Maryland, 1989; Chapter 409, Laws of Maryland, 1990; and for any of the following State projects.
