

(2) EACH GOVERNMENTAL UNIT OR QUASI-PUBLIC CORPORATION THAT HAS AT LEAST 1 COVERED EMPLOYEE.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 101, § 21(a).

In item (1) of this section, the former phrase "in the State" is deleted as unnecessary in light of § 9-203 of this subtitle and as possibly misleading since, under certain circumstances, an employer may be liable to pay compensation to a covered employee who works outside of the State.

In items (1) and (2) of this section, the phrase "subject to this article", which formerly modified "employees", is deleted as unnecessary in light of the definition of "covered employee". As to the definition of "covered employee", see § 9-101 of this title.

The Labor and Employment Article Review Committee notes, for consideration by the General Assembly, that, while this section makes this title applicable to a "quasi-public corporation", it does not make this title applicable to other quasi-public entities, such as a quasi-public association. The General Assembly may wish to consider making this title applicable to noncorporate quasi-public entities.

9-202. COVERED EMPLOYEE.

(A) IN GENERAL.

EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED, AN INDIVIDUAL, INCLUDING A MINOR, IS A COVERED EMPLOYEE WHILE IN THE SERVICE OF AN EMPLOYER UNDER AN EXPRESS OR IMPLIED CONTRACT OF APPRENTICESHIP OR HIRE.

(B) UNLAWFUL EMPLOYMENT — MINORS.

A MINOR MAY BE A COVERED EMPLOYEE UNDER THIS SECTION EVEN IF THE MINOR IS EMPLOYED UNLAWFULLY.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 101, § 21(b)(1), as that item related to individuals in the service of an employer under a contract of hire.

The word "minor" is substituted for the former phrase "person under eighteen years of age", for brevity. See Art. 1, § 24 of the Code.

In subsection (a) of this section, the word "individual" is substituted for the former word "person", since this title covers only a human being. As to the definition of "person", see § 1-101 of this article.
