

Former Art. 56, § 112A(c), which specified that “[a]ny civil penalty” shall be paid into the General Fund of the State, and former Art. 56, § 126(d), which specified that “a purse or other compensation forfeited and collected under this section” shall be paid to the Comptroller for deposit into the General Fund, are deleted as included in the broader language of this section.

4-207. AUTHORITY OF SECRETARY.

THE COMMISSION EXERCISES ITS POWERS AND DUTIES SUBJECT TO THE AUTHORITY OF THE SECRETARY.

4-208. TERMINATION OF CERTAIN PROVISIONS.

SUBJECT TO THE EVALUATION AND REESTABLISHMENT PROVISIONS OF THE MARYLAND PROGRAM EVALUATION ACT, THIS SUBTITLE AND SUBTITLE 3 OF THIS TITLE AND ALL REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE AND SUBTITLE 3 OF THIS TITLE SHALL TERMINATE ON JULY 1, 2001.

REVISOR’S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 56, § 127A.

The former reference to “§§ 109 through 113, 115, 120, and 122 ... creating the State Athletic Commission and relating to the regulation of boxing shows or wrestling matches” is deleted as unnecessary in light of the reference to “this subtitle and Subtitle 3 of this title”.

The Maryland Program Evaluation Act is Title 8, Subtitle 4 of the State Government Article.

GENERAL REVISOR’S NOTE TO SUBTITLE:

The first and fourth sentences of former Art. 56, § 110, which described the position of the Commission Secretary and provided for compensation and reimbursement for expenses, are deleted as unnecessary and obsolete. The Office of Secretary to the Commission no longer exists in practice. Instead, there is an executive secretary who functions as the chief administrator of the Commission. Like all other staffers, the executive secretary is provided through the Department and thus is compensated in accordance with the State budget and is subject to the Merit System provisions. Also, the former reference to the “present secretary” is deleted as obsolete because the individual who was secretary when the provision was enacted in 1960 no longer holds the position.
