such] THE report shall include a complete operating and financial statement covering the operations of the district during the year. The commission shall cause an audit to be made of the books and accounts of the district at least once each year by certified public accountants [and the]. THE cost [thereof] OF THE AUDIT shall be treated as an item of administrative expense.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the changes to Article 2B, Section 5(a) and (i)(1) AND (5) relating to the issuance of a micro-brewery (on- and off-sale) license in Dorchester County shall take effect July 1, 1989. These changes shall remain effective for a period of three years and, at the end of June 30, 1992, and with no further action required by the General Assembly, these changes shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect. The termination of the authority of the State Comptroller to issue a micro-brewery (on- and off-sale) license in Dorchester County after 3 years does not affect the ability of a holder of a Class 1 micro-brewery license to continue to exercise all the privileges authorized by the license after June 30, 1992.
