and appropriate information as requested. The Commissioner, based on the information reported under this section, shall also make recommendations relating to the termination of limited benefits policies and the transition to nonlimited benefit policies.]

Chapter 463 of the Acts of 1991

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Department of Education shall, SUBJECT TO § 2–1312 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, submit a report on the effect of exempting a 5 year old child from kindergarten if the child is enrolled full-time in a licensed child care center or registered family day care home or part-time in a Head Start 5 year old program, on or before July 1, 1994 to the Senate Economic and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Constitutional and Administrative Law Committee. The report shall contain information on the number of 5 year old children enrolled full-time in a licensed child care center or registered family day care home or part-time in a Head Start 5 year old program for the school years 1992–1993 and 1993–1994; the qualifications of staff members working in licensed child care centers, registered family day care homes, and Head Start programs; the extent of in-service training of these staff members; the educational curriculum of these child care programs; the staff/child ratios in licensed child care centers, registered family day care homes, and Head Start programs; and the readiness of the children enrolled in these child care programs to enter first grade.
