

(l) (1) The provisions of subsection (a) of this section are not applicable in Frederick County. In Frederick County, between the hours of 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. on any day, a person may not consume any alcoholic beverages on any premises open to the general public, any place of public entertainment, or any place at which setups or other component parts of mixed alcoholic drinks are sold under any license issued under the provisions of [Article 56] THE BUSINESS REGULATION ARTICLE, and any owner, operator, employee, or manager of said premises or places may not knowingly permit such consumption.

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(d) Notwithstanding the provisions of § 114 or of any other contrary provisions of this article, the possession of alcoholic beverages upon the premises of a licensee under the provisions of this article is not unlawful under any of the following conditions:

(3) When the alcoholic beverages have been brought upon the premises of a race track licensed under the provisions of [Article 78B of this Code] THE MARYLAND HORSE RACING ACT, and the track is licensed for the sale of alcoholic beverages under this article, so long as the alcoholic beverages under this article [, so long as the alcoholic beverages] have not been furnished by the licensee.

Article 23A – Corporations – Municipal

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(b) In addition to, but not in substitution of, the powers which have been, or may hereafter be, granted to it, such legislative body also shall have the following express ordinance-making powers:

(32) To exercise the licensing authority granted in [Article 56] THE BUSINESS REGULATION ARTICLE and other provisions of law.

(b) Nothing in this section shall be construed to apply to or affect in any manner the operation of pari-mutuel betting conducted pursuant to the provisions of [Article 78B of this Code, title "Racing Commission"] THE MARYLAND HORSE RACING ACT; and nothing in this section shall be construed to apply to or affect in any manner the operation of the games or devices commonly known as bingo, carnivals, raffles, bazaars, and similar games of entertainment, or of mechanical or electrical devices which require the insertion of a coin or token for their operation, commonly known as "slot machines," heretofore authorized and legalized within this State.
