(e) [Any "additional employee"] AN ADDITIONAL EMPLOYEE OR AGENT of the [Maryland] STATE Racing Commission whose salary payments from the State are subject to reimbursement to the State by licensees of the STATE Racing Commission under [Article 78B of the Code] THE MARYLAND HORSE RACING ACT shall become a member of this pension system as a condition of employment, subject to the employee's eligibility for membership being determined by the Board of Trustees. The employer's share of the contribution shall be:

(1) An obligation of the racetracks of the State; and

(2) Paid in the manner as the salary payments under [Article 78B] THE MARYLAND HORSE RACING ACT are paid.

Article – Agriculture

10-303.

(a) The Board shall encourage and foster agriculture in the State through promotion and assistance of agricultural fairs, exhibits, or other activities. For this purpose, the Board, subject to the approval of the Secretary, has exclusive, complete control of the distribution and expenditure of all funds allocated to it pursuant to the provisions of [Article 78B of this Code] THE MARYLAND HORSE RACING ACT for the payment of premium awards, promotional and educational activities, or other activities in connection with a bona fide agricultural fair, exhibit, or activity, as the Board determines, and for one State fair each year, as designated by the Board. The Board shall administer the distribution of the grant provided in [§ 19 (a)] § 11-403(b) of [Article 78B] THE BUSINESS REGULATION ARTICLE to the Maryland State Fair and Agricultural Society, Inc.
