2. Does not itself provide any home health care service;

#### **Article – Labor and Employment**

9-212.

(a) (1) This section applies to each jockey licensed by the [Maryland] STATE Racing Commission to ride a thoroughbred horse.

(2) This section applies only at a thoroughbred racing association or training facility under the jurisdiction of the [Maryland] STATE Racing Commission.

(c) (1) For the purposes of this title, the joint employers of a jockey who is a covered employee under this section are:

(ii) each owner or trainer who is subject to assessment under [Article 78B, § 32 of the Code] § 11-906 OF THE BUSINESS REGULATION ARTICLE at the time of any occurrence for which benefits are payable to the jockey under this title.

(d) An owner or trainer of a racehorse who is considered an employer under § 9-212 of this title is in compliance with the requirements of this subtitle if the owner or trainer is in compliance with the requirements of [Article 78B, § 32 of the Code] § 11-906 OF THE BUSINESS REGULATION ARTICLE.
