

(i) To protect the public health and safety, the Board may adopt rules and regulations regarding the equipment and sanitation of the manufacturing or packaging operations that are subject to this section.

(j) (1) A manufacturing permit expires on the December 31 after its effective date, unless the manufacturing permit is renewed for a 1-year term as provided in this subsection.

(2) At least 1 month before a manufacturing permit expires, the Board shall send to the manufacturing permit holder, by first-class mail to the last known address of the manufacturing permit holder, a renewal notice that contains a statement of:

(i) The date on which the current manufacturing permit expires;

(ii) The date by which the renewal application must be received by the Board for the renewal to be issued and mailed before the manufacturing permit expires; and

(iii) The amount of the renewal fee.

(3) Before a manufacturing permit expires, a manufacturing permit holder periodically may renew it for an additional 1-year term, if the manufacturing permit holder:

(i) Otherwise is entitled to a manufacturing permit;

(ii) Pays to the Board a renewal fee set by the Board; and

(iii) Submits to the Board a renewal application on the form that the Board requires.

(4) The Board shall renew the manufacturing permit of each manufacturing permit holder who meets the requirements of this title.

(k) A manufacturing permit holder shall display the permit conspicuously in the place for which it is issued.

(l) A manufacturing permit is not transferable.

(m) A person may not violate any rule or regulation adopted under this section.

(n) A manufacturing permit is void on conviction of the manufacturing permit holder for any violation of:

(1) This section; or

(2) Any rule or regulation adopted by the Board under this section.
