

(2) Each eligible youth services bureau shall submit to the Department a proposed annual budget for review and approval, at the times that the Department specifies.

(3) The proposed budget of the Department shall list the eligible youth services bureaus and estimate the amount of State funds to be allocated to each.

(4) At the option of the local governing body that provides the matching funds for an eligible youth services bureau, the State funds for the support of the eligible youth services bureau shall be paid directly to its private sponsor or to the local governing body. Before the State funds are paid, the fiscal officer of the local government shall certify, in writing, the source of the 25 percent local funds.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.

CHAPTER 41

(House Bill 250)

AN ACT concerning

Procurement – Reporting of Minority Business Participation

FOR the purpose of establishing the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs as the office responsible for receiving department and agency reports regarding annual minority participation in procurement contracts; and requiring the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs to summarize and report the information to the Board of Public Works and to the Legislative Policy Committee.
