be charged to third parties for all State MEDEVAC transports (accident scene and inter-hospital transfers), collection policies and procedures and the relationship between public and private air ambulance services in Maryland. The report shall be submitted to the budget committees on January 1, 1993.

Further provided that the Maryland State Police shall not maintain a presence at the Maryland Port Administration after June 1, 1993 and that the five State Police positions currently assigned to the Maryland Department of Transportation's Maryland Port Administration shall be abolished on June 1, 1993. It is the intent of the General Assembly that the State Police could return to the Maryland Port Administration in the future, to perform investigations or re-establish a presence if necessary.
