

**SECTION 30. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:**

**(1) (A) General Fund appropriations listed herein shall be reduced as provided in this section contingent on failure to enact, before July 1, 1992, SB 387, HB 236, or HB 236 and HB 240, legislation designated as a substitute for SB 387, HB 236, or HB 236 and HB 240, or legislation enacted at a special or extended session of the General Assembly, which increases general fund revenues beyond the March estimate of the Board of Revenue estimate by at least \$252,000,000.**

**(B) If the amount of revenue resulting from legislation referenced in (A) is less than \$252,000,000:**

**(i) The following appropriations, made in Supplemental Budget No. 2, shall be reduced by up to the amounts indicated, in the priority listed, to the extent that the revenue increase in excess of \$177,000,000 does not exceed the sum of the appropriations listed:**

**(ii) The following appropriations, made in Section 1, shall be reduced by up to the amounts indicated, provided that each reduction shall be adjusted downward in proportion to the extent that the revenue increase is less than \$177,000,000:**
