

[(c) (1) If the alleged abuser is not served the temporary ex parte order and does not appear for the protective order hearing, the court may continue the temporary ex parte order for not more than 30 days.

(2) In a case of alleged child abuse or alleged abuse of a vulnerable adult, the court may continue the temporary ex parte order for not more than 30 days.

(d) If the alleged abuser appears for the protective order hearing or the court otherwise has personal jurisdiction over that household member, the court:

(1) may proceed with the protective order hearing; and

(2) if the court finds by clear and convincing evidence that the alleged abuse has occurred, may grant a protective order to stop the abuse.

(e) The protective order shall order the alleged abuser to refrain from abusing household members and may:

(1) except in a case of alleged child abuse or alleged abuse of a vulnerable adult, order the alleged abuser to vacate the family home immediately and grant temporary possession of the family home to the petitioner for not more than 30 days;

(2) in a case of alleged child abuse or alleged abuse of a vulnerable adult, order the alleged abuser to vacate the family home immediately and grant temporary possession of the family home to an adult household member for not more than 30 days;

(3) award temporary custody of a minor household member;

(4) direct any or all of the household members to participate in a professionally supervised counseling program; and

(5) order any other relief as necessary.]

(C) IF THE RESPONDENT APPEARS FOR THE PROTECTIVE ORDER HEARING, HAS BEEN SERVED WITH THE TEMPORARY EX PARTE ORDER, OR THE COURT OTHERWISE HAS PERSONAL JURISDICTION OVER THE RESPONDENT, THE COURT:

(1) MAY PROCEED WITH THE PROTECTIVE ORDER HEARING;  
AND

(2) IF THE COURT FINDS BY ~~A PREPONDERANCE OF THE CLEAR AND CONVINCING~~ EVIDENCE THAT THE ALLEGED ABUSE HAS OCCURRED, OR IF THE RESPONDENT CONSENTS TO THE ENTRY OF A PROTECTIVE ORDER, THE COURT MAY GRANT A PROTECTIVE ORDER TO PROTECT ANY PERSON ELIGIBLE FOR RELIEF FROM ABUSE.

(D) THE PROTECTIVE ORDER MAY INCLUDE ANY OR ALL OF THE FOLLOWING RELIEF:

(1) ORDER THE RESPONDENT TO REFRAIN FROM ABUSING OR THREATENING TO ABUSE ANY PERSON ELIGIBLE FOR RELIEF;
