

2. If a vacancy is for a reason other than expiration of the term, at any time before the Governor makes the appointment, if the organization complies with the reasonable request of the Governor for the list.

(iv) If a list is not submitted to the Governor as required under subparagraph (iii) of this paragraph, within 3 months after a request is made by the Governor, the Governor may appoint any professional individual who meets the requirements under subsection (b) of this section.

(4) Of the 5 nonvoting members:

(i) 1 shall be a representative of the State Health Planning and Development Agency, appointed by the Secretary; and

(ii) 4 shall be representatives of the Department, appointed by the Secretary.

(b) Each professional individual selected for the [Commission] ADVISORY COUNCIL shall be knowledgeable in the diagnosis and treatment of hereditary and congenital disorders.

(c) (1) The term of a voting member is 4 years.

(2) The terms of the voting members are staggered as required by the terms provided for voting members of the [Commission] ADVISORY COUNCIL on July 1, 1982. The terms of those members end as follows:

(i) 3 in 1983;

(ii) 3 in 1984;

(iii) 3 in 1985; and

(iv) 2 in 1986.

(3) At the end of a term, a voting member continues to serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies.

(4) A voting member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.

(5) A voting member who serves 2 consecutive full 4-year terms may not be reappointed for 4 years after completion of those terms.

(6) When a vacancy occurs, a successor shall be appointed promptly.

From among its voting members, the [Commission] ADVISORY COUNCIL shall elect every 2 years a chairman and a vice chairman.
