- 2. If a vacancy is for a reason other than expiration of the term, at any time before the Governor makes the appointment, if the organization complies with the reasonable request of the Governor for the list.
- (iv) If a list is not submitted to the Governor as required under subparagraph (iii) of this paragraph, within 3 months after a request is made by the Governor, the Governor may appoint any professional individual who meets the requirements under subsection (b) of this section.
 - (4) Of the 5 nonvoting members:
- (i) 1 shall be a representative of the State Health Planning and Development Agency, appointed by the Secretary; and
- (ii) 4 shall be representatives of the Department, appointed by the Secretary.
- (b) Each professional individual selected for the [Commission] ADVISORY COUNCIL shall be knowledgeable in the diagnosis and treatment of hereditary and congenital disorders.
 - (c) (1) The term of a voting member is 4 years.
- (2) The terms of the voting members are staggered as required by the terms provided for voting members of the [Commission] ADVISORY COUNCIL on July 1, 1982. The terms of those members end as follows:
 - (i) 3 in 1983;
 - (ii) 3 in 1984;
 - (iii) 3 in 1985; and
 - (iv) 2 in 1986.
- (3) At the end of a term, a voting member continues to serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
- (4) A voting member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
- (5) A voting member who serves 2 consecutive full 4-year terms may not be reappointed for 4 years after completion of those terms.
- (6) When a vacancy occurs, a successor shall be appointed promptly. 13-105.

From among its voting members, the [Commission] ADVISORY COUNCIL shall elect every 2 years a chairman and a vice chairman.
