SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings

1-302.

(a) In this section, "former judge" means a judge who previously served in a court.

(d) [(1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a] A former judge recalled under this section may not be temporarily assigned for more than 180 working days in any calendar year. However, if the case which the former judge is hearing at the end of the 180-day period is not concluded, the time may be extended until that case is concluded.

[(2) In Charles, Prince George's, and Harford Counties a former judge recalled under this section may not be temporarily assigned for more than 90 working days in any calendar year. However, if the case which the former judge is hearing at the end of the 90-day period is not concluded, the time may be extended until that case is concluded.]

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1992.
