FOR the purpose of altering civil penalties for violations of pesticide application laws and regulations; providing that each day a violation occurs certain subsequent violations occur a violation occurs is a separate violation; prohibiting certain total penalties from exceeding a certain amount; and generally relating to penalties for pesticide application violations.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Agriculture

5-210.2.

- (a) (1) [In lieu of, or in addition to, suspension of the license, permit or certificate, the Secretary may impose a civil penalty of not more than \$1,000] A PERSON WHO VIOLATES ANY PROVISION OF THIS SUBTITLE IS SUBJECT TO A CIVIL PENALTY OF NOT MORE THAN \$5,000 FOR EACH \$2,500 FOR A FIRST VIOLATION OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- (2) (1) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES ANY PROVISION OF THIS SUBTITLE IS SUBJECT TO A CIVIL PENALTY OF NOT MORE THAN \$5,000 FOR EACH SUBSEQUENT VIOLATION OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- <u>(II)</u> FOR PURPOSES OF THIS PARAGRAPH, AFTER A FIRST VIOLATION:
- (3) EACH DAY A VIOLATION <u>UNDER THIS SUBSECTION</u> OCCURS IS A SEPARATE VIOLATION <del>UNDER THIS SUBSECTION</del>.
- [(b)](3) (4) In addition to THE DENIAL, SUSPENSION, OR revocation of the license, permit or certificate, the Secretary may impose a civil penalty of not more than [\$1,000] \$5,000 ON THE HOLDER OF A LICENSE, PERMIT, OR CERTIFICATE UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OR (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION FOR EACH VIOLATION OF THIS SUBTITLE.
