6-415.

- (A) A charitable organization may solicit charitable contributions or spend them only for a charitable purpose that is stated in its registration statement and most recent annual report.
- (B) ON THE REQUEST OF A DONOR, A CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION SHALL INCLUDE IN EACH SOLICITATION A CLEAR DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAMS AND USES FOR WHICH FUNDS ARE REQUESTED. EXPENDITURES SHALL BE RELATED IN A PRIMARY DEGREE TO THE STATED PURPOSE (PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES) AND SHALL BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH REASONABLE DONOR EXPECTATIONS PROVIDE THE DONOR WITH A STATEMENT OF THE PROGRAMS AND USES FOR WHICH THE FUNDS ARE REQUESTED.
- (C) A CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION SHALL ESTABLISH AND EXERCISE CONTROLS OVER FUND-RAISING ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED FOR ITS BENEFIT, BY ITSELF OR BY A PROFESSIONAL SOLICITOR OR FUND-RAISING COUNSEL—INCLUDING WRITTEN—CONTRACTS—AND AGREEMENTS, AND SHALL ENSURE THAT FUND RAISING ACTIVITIES ARE CONDUCTED WITHOUT EXCESSIVE PRESSURE.
- (D) A CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION SHALL SUBSTANTIATE A VALID GOVERNING STRUCTURE MAY NOT MISREPRESENT THE PURPOSE FOR WHICH FUNDS ARE SOLICITED.

6-501.

- (a) An agreement between a charitable organization and a USED GOODS DEALER, fund raising counsel, or professional solicitor shall be in writing.
- (b) A USED GOODS DEALER, fund raising counsel, or professional solicitor shall submit to the Secretary of State a copy of the agreement on or before the earlier of:
 - (1) the tenth day after the agreement is made; or
 - (2) the start of a charitable solicitation.
- (e) The text that a professional solicitor or associate solicitor uses in a charitable solicitation shall include:
- (1) the name of the charitable organization for which the charitable solicitation is made:
- (2) the specific charitable purpose that is to be advanced with charitable contributions as shown in the registration statement; and
 - (3) the fact that the person who solicits charitable contributions:
 - (i) is a paid fund raiser; and
