CHAPTER 127

(House Bill 212)

AN ACT concerning

State Railroad Administration – Transfer of Functions to the Mass Transit Administration

FOR the purpose of abolishing the State Railroad Administration as a unit of the Department of Transportation; transferring its powers, duties, and responsibilities to the Mass Transit Administration; amending certain definitions and defining certain terms; clarifying relocation provisions and providing for the construction of certain provisions; authorizing the adoption and enforcement of regulations for parking and control of vehicles and unauthorized equipment on Administration property with penalties of fines for violation thereof; providing for the continued effectiveness of certain rules, regulations, documents, and requirements; providing that certain references in certain documents shall be to the Mass Transit Administration; providing for the transfer of personnel from the State Railroad Administration to the Mass Transit Administration, and for the rights and privileges of employees of the State Railroad Administration; and generally relating to the transfer of the powers, duties, and responsibilities of the State Railroad Administration to the Mass Transit Administration.
