

(II) A PARTNER, PRINCIPAL OFFICER, OR DIRECTOR OF THE FOREIGN CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION OR REPRESENTATIVE.

(C) SERVICE OF PROCESS.

SERVICE OF PROCESS IS SUFFICIENT SERVICE ON A FOREIGN CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION OR REPRESENTATIVE IF:

(1) SERVICE IS MADE BY THE PERSONAL DELIVERY AND LEAVING OF A COPY OF THE PROCESS WITH THE SECRETARY OF STATE OR THE AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE; AND

(2) THE SECRETARY OF STATE SENDS A COPY OF THE PROCESS BY CERTIFIED MAIL TO THE FOREIGN CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION OR REPRESENTATIVE AT ITS LAST KNOWN ADDRESS.

REVISOR'S NOTE: Subsection (a) of this section is new language derived without substantive change from the first clause of the first sentence of former Art. 41, § 3-213 and revised as a definition to provide a concise and consistent reference to certain persons who are located out of state and who solicit in the State.

Subsection (b) of this section is new language derived without substantive change from the second clause of the first sentence of former Art. 41, § 3-213.

Subsection (c) of this section is new language derived without substantive change from the second and third sentences of former Art. 41, § 3-213.

In the introductory language of subsection (b) of this section, the former reference to "subpoena duces tecum" is deleted as obsolete. As to subpoenas for tangible evidence, see Md. Rule 4-264.

In subsection (c)(1) of this section, the words "or the authorized representative of the Secretary of State" are added to conform to practice.

In subsection (c)(2) of this section, the former reference to "registered" mail is deleted in light of Art. 1, § 20 of the Code, which makes the terms "registered mail" and "certified mail" interchangeable. The reference to "certified" mail conforms to the language used throughout the revised articles of the Code.

The Business Regulation Article Review Committee notes, for consideration by the General Assembly, that in subsection (a) of this section the former phrase "which solicits contributions from people in this State" is deleted because a fund-raising counsel does not solicit charitable contributions.
