

AN APPLICANT FOR REGISTRATION AS A PROFESSIONAL SOLICITOR MAY SUBMIT A CONSOLIDATED BOND FOR ALL OF THE OFFICERS, AGENTS, MEMBERS, ASSOCIATE SOLICITORS, AND EMPLOYEES OF THE PROFESSIONAL SOLICITOR.

6-304. ISSUANCE OF REGISTRATION.

(A) FOR QUALIFIED APPLICANTS.

IF THE SECRETARY OF STATE FINDS THAT AN APPLICANT FOR REGISTRATION HAS COMPLIED WITH THIS TITLE AND THE REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER IT, THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL APPROVE THE APPLICATION.

(B) INACTION CONSIDERED APPROVAL.

IF THE SECRETARY OF STATE NEITHER APPROVES NOR DENIES AN APPLICATION WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER RECEIVING IT, THE APPLICATION IS APPROVED.

In this section, the words "applicant" and "application" are substituted for the former words "registrant" and "registration" because a person remains an applicant and an application remains an application until the application is approved.

6-305. TERM OF REGISTRATION.

EACH REGISTRATION EXPIRES ON THE FIRST ANNIVERSARY OF ITS EFFECTIVE DATE.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 41, §§ 3-206(b), 3-207(c), and 3-208(b).

Former references to renewal, renewal fees, and proof that the bond for professional solicitors remains in effect are deleted because in practice charitable representatives do not renew their registrations but instead reapply for new registrations each year.
