In subsections (a) and (d)(1) of this section, the defined term "creditable service" is substituted for "membership service" for clarity.

In subsection (d) of this section, the phrase "credit for unused sick leave" is substituted for "sick leave" for clarity.

In subsection (d)(2) of this section, the phrase "to compute average final compensation" is substituted for "average final compensation" to clarify that unused sick leave is not to be used in relation to the calculation of average final compensation.

The only other changes are stylistic or technical.

#### 6-303. PURCHASE OF CREDIT BY PAYMENT OF MEMBER'S CONTRIBUTIONS AND INTEREST.

(A) AT ANY TIME BEFORE RETIREMENT, A MEMBER MAY PURCHASE CREDIT FOR ANY PERIOD OF EMPLOYMENT FROM JULY 1, 1970, THROUGH JUNE 30, 1972, DURING WHICH A MEMBER ELECTED TO DELAY ENROLLMENT IN THE SYSTEM.

(B) A MEMBER WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO PURCHASE CREDIT UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION MAY PURCHASE THE CREDIT BY MAKING A SINGLE PAYMENT CONSISTING OF THE CONTRIBUTIONS THE MEMBER WOULD HAVE MADE UNDER THIS SYSTEM DURING THE PERIOD BEING PURCHASED, WITH REGULAR INTEREST TO DATE OF PAYMENT.

#### 6-304. REDEPOSIT OF ACCUMULATED CONTRIBUTIONS.

A MEMBER OF THIS RETIREMENT SYSTEM WHO PREVIOUSLY TERMINATED MEMBERSHIP AND WITHDREW ACCUMULATED CONTRIBUTIONS FROM EITHER THIS SYSTEM, THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM, OR THE TEACHERS' RETIREMENT SYSTEM MAY REGAIN CREDIT FOR THE PREVIOUS SERVICE BY DEPOSITING IN A LUMP SUM, IN THIS SYSTEM, THE ACCUMULATED CONTRIBUTIONS PREVIOUSLY
