

(B) THE SUPERINTENDENT OF MARYLAND STATE POLICE, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES, MAY ORDER ANY MEMBER IN SERVICE WHO HAS ATTAINED THE AGE OF 50 TO RETIRE ON THE FIRST DAY OF THE NEXT MONTH AFTER THE MEMBER IS NOTIFIED OF THE SUPERINTENDENT'S ORDER. HOWEVER, BEFORE APPROVING THE SUPERINTENDENT'S ORDER, THE BOARD SHALL GIVE THE MEMBER AT LEAST 30 DAYS' NOTICE AND AN OPPORTUNITY TO BE HEARD.

(C) (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, ANY MEMBER WHO HAS ATTAINED AGE 60 SHALL BE RETIRED ON THE FIRST DAY OF THE NEXT MONTH AFTER ATTAINING THAT AGE.

(2) THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBSECTION DO NOT APPLY TO THE SUPERINTENDENT.

(D) THE ALLOWANCE UNDER THIS SECTION IS A SERVICE RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE EQUAL TO THE FOLLOWING:

(1) ONE FORTY-FIFTH OF THE MEMBER'S AVERAGE FINAL COMPENSATION FOR EACH YEAR OF THE FIRST 25 YEARS OF CREDITABLE SERVICE; AND

(2) ONE-NINETIETH OF THE MEMBER'S AVERAGE FINAL COMPENSATION FOR EACH YEAR AFTER THE FIRST 25 YEARS OF CREDITABLE SERVICE.

COMMITTEE NOTE: Subsections (a), (b), and (c) of this section are new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 88B, § 53(a).

Subsection (a) of this section is derived from former § 53(a)(1)(i). The last sentence of former § 53(a)(1)(i) is deleted since the position of physician for the Department has been reclassified as a civilian position and the physician may no longer be a member of this retirement system.

Subsection (b) of this section is derived from former § 53 (a)(2).

Subsection (c) of this section is derived from former § 53 (a)(3).

The part of the first sentence of former § 53(a)(3) as it relates to the physician of the Department is deleted as obsolete. See the discussion above that pertains to subsection (a) of this section.

Former § 53(a)(1)(ii) now appears as § 6-402 of this subtitle.

Subsection (d) of this section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 88B, § 53(b)(1). The second sentence of former § 53(b)(1) and § 53(b)(3) are deleted as obsolete.

Former § 53(b)(2) now appears in § 6-407 of this title.
