

- (1) AN AMOUNT IN EFFECT ON JUNE 1, 1968; OR
- (2) THE AMOUNT BY WHICH:

(I) THE RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE OF THE FORMER JUDGE IS LESS THAN \$20,000; OR

(II) THE RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE OF THE SURVIVING SPOUSE OF THE FORMER JUDGE IS LESS THAN \$10,000.

In subsection (c) of this section, the new language is substituted for the former provision to allow for the interpretation of the 2 limits on supplementation in former §§ 56(e) and 58(c). The limit in former § 58(c) was added by Ch. 468 of the Acts of 1968. The limit in former § 56(e) was added by Ch. 483 of the Acts of 1974, but did not provide for its interrelation with the previous limit.

Former § 58(d) is deleted as redundant. See §§ 1-301 through 1-306 for the applicable revised provisions.

SUBTITLE 2. OTHER JUDICIAL PLANS.

9-201. RETIREMENT PLAN FOR JUDGES OF THE FORMER MUNICIPAL COURT OF BALTIMORE CITY.

(A) EVERY JUDGE OF THE MUNICIPAL COURT OF BALTIMORE CITY WHO IS RETIRED FROM ACTIVE SERVICE OR IS IN OFFICE ON JUNE 30, 1970, AND EVERY APPOINTED JUDGE IN OFFICE ON JUNE 30, 1970, IF SUBSEQUENTLY ELECTED, INCLUDING A JUDGE WHO WAS CONTINUED IN OFFICE AS A JUDGE OF THE DISTRICT COURT PURSUANT TO ARTICLE IV, § 41-I(A) OF THE CONSTITUTION, MAY ELECT PLAN A AND THEREBY BE PAID, AFTER THE TERMINATION OF THE JUDGE'S ACTIVE SERVICE, IF THE JUDGE IS THEN AT LEAST SIXTY YEARS OF AGE OR WHEN THE JUDGE BECOMES SIXTY YEARS OF AGE, A PENSION OR SALARY CALCULATED AT THE RATE OF SIX HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$600.00) PER ANNUM FOR EACH YEAR OR ANY PART THEREOF OF ACTIVE SERVICE AS A JUDGE OF SAID MUNICIPAL COURT, AND OF THE DISTRICT COURT, UP TO AND INCLUDING TWENTY YEARS OF SUCH ACTIVE SERVICE, SO THAT A MAXIMUM PENSION OR SALARY FOR SUCH SERVICE PAYABLE UNDER THIS SECTION TO ANY ONE PERSON SHALL NOT EXCEED THE SUM OF TWELVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$12,000.00) PER ANNUM.

(B) EVERY JUDGE DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION WHO DOES NOT ELECT TO BE PAID A PENSION OR SALARY UNDER PLAN A, AND EVERY JUDGE WHO TAKES OFFICE AFTER JUNE 30, 1970, SHALL BE PLACED UNDER PLAN B AND SHALL BE PAID, AFTER TERMINATION OF THE JUDGE'S ACTIVE SERVICE, IF THE JUDGE IS THEN AT LEAST SIXTY YEARS OF AGE OR WHEN THE JUDGE BECOMES SIXTY YEARS OF AGE, A PENSION OR SALARY IN AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO SIXTY PER CENTUM (60%) OF HIS MAXIMUM SALARY, OR ONE SIXTEENTH (1/16) OF THAT AMOUNT
