

(i) Shall provide comprehensive medical and other health care for indigent individuals or medically indigent individuals or both;

(ii) Shall provide, subject to the limitations of the State budget and the availability of federal funds, comprehensive medical and other health care for all pregnant women and, at a minimum, all children currently under the age of 1 whose family income falls below 185 percent of the poverty level, as permitted by the federal law;

(iii) Shall provide, subject to the limitations of the State budget and the availability of federal funds, comprehensive medical and other health care for all children from the age of 1 year up through and including the age of 5 years whose family income falls below 133 percent of the poverty level, as permitted by the federal law;

(iv) [May] SHALL provide, subject to the limitations of the State budget and the availability of federal funds, comprehensive medical care and other health care for all children [from the age of 6 up through and including the age of 7] BORN AFTER SEPTEMBER 30, 1983 WHO ARE AT LEAST 6 YEARS OF AGE BUT ARE UNDER 19 YEARS OF AGE whose family income falls below 100 percent of the poverty level, as permitted by federal law; and

(v) May include bedside nursing care for eligible Program recipients.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1992.

(House Bill 312)

AN ACT concerning

Maryland Egg Law – Registration of Packers and Distributors

FOR the purpose of requiring a packer or distributor of shell eggs to register with the Secretary of Agriculture; ~~authorizing the Secretary of Agriculture to deny, suspend, or revoke a registration; authorizing the Secretary to establish~~ establishing certain registration fees; creating an Egg Law Fund for a certain purpose for all fees collected; defining certain terms; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally relating to the registration of packers and distributors of shell eggs.
