- (27) Refuses, withholds from, denies, or discriminates against an individual with regard to the provision of professional services for which the licensee is licensed and qualified to render because the individual is HIV positive;
- (28) EXCEPT IN AN EMERGENCY LIFE-THREATENING SITUATION WHERE IT IS NOT FEASIBLE OR PRACTICABLE, FAILS TO COMPLY WITH THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL'S GUIDELINES ON UNIVERSAL PRECAUTIONS; OR
- (29) FAILS TO DISPLAY THE NOTICE REQUIRED UNDER § 4–313(D) OF THIS TITLE.
- (b) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 4-318 of this subtitle, the Board may deny a general license to practice dental hygiene, a teacher's license to practice dental hygiene, or a temporary license to practice dental hygiene to any applicant, reprimand any licensed dental hygienist, place any licensed dental hygienist on probation, or suspend or revoke the license of any licensed dental hygienist, if the applicant or licensee:
- (14) Willfully fails to file or record any report as required by law, willfully impedes or obstructs the filing or recording of the report, or induces another to fail to file or record the report; [or]
- (15) Refuses, withholds from, denies, or discriminates against an individual with regard to the provision of professional services for which the licensee is licensed and qualified to render because the individual is HIV positive; OR
- (16) EXCEPT IN AN EMERGENCY LIFE-THREATENING SITUATION WHERE IT IS NOT FEASIBLE OR PRACTICABLE, FAILS TO COMPLY WITH THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL'S GUIDELINES ON UNIVERSAL PRECAUTIONS.

In addition to the powers and duties set forth elsewhere in this title, the Board has the following powers and duties:

- (1) To adopt rules and regulations to carry out the provisions of this title;
- (2) To adopt standards for the practice of electrology;
- (3) To keep records of its proceedings;
- (4) To keep a list of all currently licensed electrologists and licensed electrology instructors;
 - (5) To submit an annual report to the Governor and the Secretary;
 - (6) To establish continuing education requirements;
 - (7) To refer to the State's Attorney any alleged violation of this title;
- (8) In accordance with the State budget, to incur any necessary expense that relates to the referral of an alleged violation of the criminal provisions of this title; [and]
