

(9) To review advertising by any licensee or any institution that offers a program that is approved under this title; AND

(10) ON RECEIPT OF A WRITTEN AND SIGNED COMPLAINT, INCLUDING A REFERRAL FROM THE COMMISSIONER OF LABOR AND INDUSTRY, CONDUCT AN UNANNOUNCED INSPECTION OF THE OFFICE OF AN ELECTROLOGIST, OTHER THAN AN OFFICE OF AN ELECTROLOGIST IN A HOSPITAL, RELATED INSTITUTION, FREESTANDING MEDICAL FACILITY, OR A FREESTANDING BIRTHING CENTER, TO DETERMINE COMPLIANCE AT THAT OFFICE WITH THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL'S GUIDELINES ON UNIVERSAL PRECAUTIONS.

(a) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 6-314 of this subtitle, the Board may deny a license to any applicant, reprimand any licensee, place any licensee on probation, or suspend or revoke a license if the applicant or licensee:

(22) Commits an act of unprofessional conduct in the practice of electrology;
[or]

(23) Refuses, withholds from, denies, or discriminates against an individual with regard to the provision of professional services for which the licensee is licensed and qualified to render because the individual is HIV positive;

(24) EXCEPT IN AN EMERGENCY LIFE-THREATENING SITUATION WHERE IT IS NOT FEASIBLE OR PRACTICABLE, FAILS TO COMPLY WITH THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL'S GUIDELINES ON UNIVERSAL PRECAUTIONS; OR

(25) FAILS TO DISPLAY THE NOTICE REQUIRED UNDER § 6-505 OF THIS TITLE.

IF AN ELECTROLOGIST IS ENGAGED IN THE PRIVATE PRACTICE OF ELECTROLOGY IN THIS STATE, THE ELECTROLOGIST SHALL DISPLAY THE NOTICE DEVELOPED UNDER § 1-207 OF THIS ARTICLE CONSPICUOUSLY IN EACH OFFICE WHERE THE ELECTROLOGIST IS ENGAGED IN PRACTICE.

In addition to the powers and duties set forth elsewhere in this title, the Board has the following powers and duties:

- (1) To adopt bylaws, rules, and regulations to carry out the provisions of this title;
- (2) To adopt a seal;
- (3) To establish procedures for licensing apprentices;
