- (9) ON RECEIPT OF A WRITTEN AND SIGNED COMPLAINT, INCLUDING A REFERRAL FROM THE COMMISSIONER OF LABOR AND INDUSTRY, CONDUCT AN UNANNOUNCED INSPECTION OF THE FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT TO DETERMINE COMPLIANCE AT THAT FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT WITH THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL'S GUIDELINES ON UNIVERSAL PRECAUTIONS.

- (a) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 7-318 of this subtitle and except as to a funeral establishment license, the Board may deny a license to any applicant, reprimand any licensee, place any licensee on probation, or suspend or revoke any license if the applicant or licensee:
- (26) Commits an act of unprofessional conduct in the practice of mortuary science; [or]
- (27) Refuses, withholds from, denies, or discriminates against an individual with regard to the provision of professional services for which the licensee is licensed and qualified to render because the individual is HIV positive; OR
- (28) EXCEPT IN AN EMERGENCY LIFE-THREATENING SITUATION WHERE IT IS NOT FEASIBLE OR PRACTICABLE, FAILS TO COMPLY WITH THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL'S GUIDELINES ON UNIVERSAL PRECAUTIONS.

- (a) In addition to the powers and duties set forth elsewhere in this title, the Board has the following powers and duties:
 - (1) To adopt rules and regulations to carry out the provisions of this title;

- (3) To adopt rules and regulations for the performance of delegated medical functions which are recognized jointly by the State Board of Physician Quality Assurance and the State Board of Nursing, under § 14–306(d) of this article;
