In addition to the powers and duties set forth elsewhere in this title, the Board has the following powers and duties:

- (1) To adopt bylaws, rules, and regulations to carry out the providence title;
 - (2) To adopt a seal;
 - (3) To establish procedures for licensing apprentices;
 - (4) To keep a list of all individuals currently licensed by the Board;
 - (5) To investigate any alleged violation of this title;
 - (6) To enforce this title;
- (7) To adopt rules and regulations regarding false and misleading advertising and misrepresentation; [and]
 - (8) To inspect licensed funeral establishments;
- (9) TO ESTABLISH STANDARDS FOR THE PRACTICE OF MORTUARY SCIENCE; AND
- (10) TO ESTABLISH STANDARDS FOR SANITATION AND WASTE DISPOSAL IN CONNECTION WITH THE PRACTICE OF MORTUARY SCIENCE. 7–302.
- (A) A MORTICIAN SHALL BE LICENSED BY THE BOARD BEFORE PRACTICING MORTUARY SCIENCE IN THIS STATE.
- (B) A MORTICIAN LICENSE ISSUED UNDER THIS TITLE AUTHORIZES THE LICENSEE TO PRACTICE MORTUARY SCIENCE WHILE THE LICENSE IS EFFECTIVE.

[7-302.] 7-303.

- (a) The Board shall determine the qualifications necessary for a person to lawfully engage in the practice of mortuary science and to operate a funeral establishment within this State. Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, to qualify for a mortician license, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the requirements of this section.
- (b) The Board shall examine all applications for licensure for the practice of mortuary science and shall issue the mortician license to any person who:
 - (1) Is judged to be of good moral character;
- (2) Has completed not less than 1 year and not more than 4 years of licensed apprenticeship, UNLESS THE BOARD ALLOWED EXTENSIONS FOR ADDITIONAL 1-YEAR TERMS;
