To apply for a mortician license, an applicant shall:

- and
- (1) Submit an application to the Board on the form that the Board requires;
 - (2) Pay to the Board a license fee set by the Board.]

7-304.

(a) An applicant who otherwise qualifies for a mortician license is entitled to be examined as provided in this section if the applicant:

- (1) Holds an apprentice license; or
- (2) Has completed the apprenticeship requirements of this title.

(b) The Board shall give examinations to applicants twice each year, at the times and places that the Board determines.

(c) The Board shall notify each qualified applicant of the time and place of examination.

(d) (1) The WRITTEN PART OF THE examination shall include:

(i) [The theoretical and practical aspects of anatomy, sanitation, disinfection, and embalming;

(ii) The methods for the care and preparation of a dead human body for burial, cremation, and shipment;

(iii) The general and local laws of this State on [burials and burial permits] THE PRACTICE OF MORTUARY SCIENCE; and

[(iv)] (II) The laws and regulations on infectious diseases.

(2) In the practical part of the examination:

(i) The Board shall provide a dead human body; and

(ii) In the presence of at least one third of the licensed members of the Board, each applicant shall demonstrate the applicant's knowledge and skill in embalming.

[(3) The written part of the examination is the national examination administered by the Conference of Funeral Service Examining Boards of the United States.
