

(2) The fee described under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall be retained by the Administration and may not be credited to the Gasoline and Motor Vehicle Revenue Account for distribution under § 8-403 or § 8-404 of this article.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1992.

CHAPTER 191

(House Bill 1043)

AN ACT concerning

Maryland Port Commission – Membership and Compensation

FOR the purpose of authorizing the Governor to appoint a member of any State board, commission, or authority to membership on the Maryland Port Commission; providing that a member of a State board, commission, or authority who is appointed under this Act and who is compensated by the State is not entitled to any other compensation, except for certain expenses, for service on the Maryland Port Commission; clarifying language; and generally relating to the appointment and compensation of members of the Maryland Port Commission.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Transportation

6-201.

(a) There is a Maryland Port Commission.

(b) The Commission shall:

(1) Establish policies directed toward improving the competitive position of the ports of Maryland within the international port industry;

(2) Adopt regulations for the operation of the Administration in a competitive manner within the port industry;

(3) Exercise those powers granted to the Commission and to the Maryland Port Administration by this title or by any other provision of law; and
