

(D) (1) THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE, THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES, THE DEPARTMENT OF JUVENILE SERVICES, AND THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION MAY USE FUNDS THAT HAVE BEEN APPROPRIATED FOR OUT-OF-HOME PLACEMENT CARE AND SERVICES TO PROVIDE FAMILY PRESERVATION SERVICES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE JOINT PLAN AND ANY REGULATIONS DEVELOPED AND ADOPTED UNDER THIS SECTION.

(2) THE JOINT PLAN DEVELOPED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION SHALL IDENTIFY OTHER RESOURCES AND STRATEGIES FOR THE PROVISION AND SUPPORT OF A BROAD RANGE OF FAMILY PRESERVATION SERVICES.

(E) SUBJECT TO § 2-1312 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, BY JULY 1, 1994, AND BY JULY 1 OF EACH YEAR THEREAFTER, THE SPECIAL SECRETARY FOR CHILDREN, YOUTH, AND FAMILIES, THE SECRETARIES OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE, HUMAN RESOURCES, JUVENILE SERVICES, AND BUDGET AND FISCAL PLANNING, AND THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS SHALL SUBMIT A JOINT REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE COSTS AND OUTCOMES OF STATE-FUNDED FAMILY PRESERVATION SERVICES FOR THE PREVIOUS FISCAL YEAR.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1992.

(House Bill 1066)

### Vehicle Laws – Temporary Registration – Extension
