- (i) the Secretary of the Environment, or the Secretary's designee, as the Chairman of the Task Force;
- (ii) the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene, or the Secretary's designee;
- (iii) the Secretary of Economic and Employment Development, or the Secretary's designee;
- (iv) 1 member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of the Senate and 1 member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the House; and
 - (v) the following members appointed by the Secretary:
- 1. 1 individual working in an industry that develops technology for the commercial incineration of controlled hazardous substances;
 - 2. 1 individual working in the cement manufacturing industry;
 - 3. 1 member of the Maryland Chamber of Commerce;
- 4. 1 individual working in an industry that has successfully implemented a toxics reduction or toxics reuse program;
- 5. 1 individual in academia or research with expertise in toxic use reduction or toxics reuse technology;
- 6. 2 individuals from the health community with expertise in environmental health;
 - 7. 2 individuals from the environment advocacy community; and
- 8. 3 citizens with expertise in either toxicology, the handling and treatment of controlled hazardous substances, or technologies for the reuse or disposal of controlled hazardous substances.
- (2) By July 1, 1992, shall convene a Commercial Hazardous Waste Incineration Task Force to advise and assist the Department in the study of the commercial incineration of hazardous waste that is required under paragraph (3) of this section, including the following representatives:
- (i) The Secretary of the Environment, or the Secretary's designee, as the Chairman of the Task Force;
- (ii) The Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene, or the Secretary's designee;
- (iii) The Secretary of Economic and Employment Development, or the Secretary's designee;
- (iv) 2 members of the Maryland Senate appointed by the President of the Senate;
