- (iii) The Board of Trustees of St. Mary's College of Maryland;
- (iv) The Maryland Higher Education Loan Corporation;
- (v) The State Advisory Council for Title I of the Higher Education Act of 1965; and
- (vi) The [New Community College of Baltimore] BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF BALTIMORE CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE.
- (i) (1) In this subsection "community college" includes the Carroll County branch campus of the Catonsville Community College and the Calvert County and St. Mary's County branch campuses of Charles County Community College established under the authority granted by § 16–203(l) of this title, and does not include [the New Community College of Baltimore] BALTIMORE CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE.
- (t) [(1) The Commission, with the advice of the Secretary, shall adopt regulations for the New Community College of Baltimore describing the categories of actions having significant financial consequences that require prior approval of the Secretary before final action of the Board of Trustees of the New Community College of Baltimore.
- (2) Notwithstanding paragraph (1) of this subsection, dispositions of any property or license, pursuant to \$ 16-605(e)(2) of this article and use of any proceeds or income pursuant to \$ 16-605(e)(3)(ii)2 of this article do not require the prior approval of the Secretary.
- (u)] The Commission shall perform any other duty delegated to it in accordance with law.

- (3) "Community college" means a community college established under this title but does not include [the New Community College of Baltimore] BALTIMORE CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE.

Subtitle 6. [New Community College of Baltimore] BALTIMORE CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE

- (a) The [creation of the New Community College of Baltimore] ESTABLISHMENT OF BALTIMORE CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE is based on the findings and policies set forth in this section.
- (b) (1) [Based on the principle that public higher education should be accessible to all those who seek and qualify for admission, the creation of a new community college in Baltimore City would represent a significant step toward this end.] PUBLIC HIGHER EDUCATION SHOULD BE ACCESSIBLE TO ALL THOSE WHO SEEK AND QUALIFY FOR ADMISSION.
