CHAPTER 241

(Senate Bill 293)

AN ACT concerning

Dorchester County Commissioners – Single-Member Districts

FOR the purpose of providing that the County Commissioners of Dorchester County shall be elected from single-member districts; authorizing the County Commissioners of Dorchester County to establish new County Commissioner districts following each decennial census; clarifying that current County Commissioner districts are those reflected in a certain consent decree; providing for the application of this Act; making stylistic changes; and generally relating to the election of the County Commissioners of Dorchester County.

Section 10-1

Article 10 – Public Local Laws of Maryland

(1984 Edition and September, 1991 Supplement, as amended)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 10 – Dorchester County

10-1.

A. There shall be [five (5)] 5 County Commissioners in Dorchester County, who constitute the Board of County Commissioners of the county.

B. (1) Dorchester County shall be divided into 5 County Commissioner districts[, as follows:

(1) Commissioner District No. 1 is composed of Taylor's Island, Lakes, Hoopers Island, the Dailsville Precinct of Cambridge, Neck, Straits, Madison and Church Creek.

(2) Commissioner District No. 2 is composed of Academy and Sandy Hill Precincts.

(3) Commissioner District No. 3 is composed of Peachblossom, Pine Street and East Cambridge Precincts.
